Directions to Wykagyl

From George Washington Bridge – North on Henry Hudson Parkway to Cross County Parkway (East) to Hutchinson River Parkway (North) to Exit 16 – Webster Avenue. Make first left onto Disbrow Lane. Go straight up to top of hill to traffic light. You will be at North Avenue. Club is directly across the street.

From TAPPAN ZEE Bridge – Cross Westchester Expressway (Rte. 287 – East) to Hutchinson River Parkway (South) to Exit 18E – Mill Road, New Rochelle. Bear right off exit ramp. Bear right at first light onto North Avenue. Travel about ¾ of a mile. Club will be on left hand side after shopping area.

From WHITESTONE/THROGS NECK Bridge - Hutchinson River Parkway (North) to Exit 16 – Webster Avenue. Make first left onto Disbrow Lane. Go straight up to top of hill to traffic light. You will be at North Avenue. Club is directly across the street.

From CONNECTICUT – Merritt Parkway leads directly to Hutchinson River Parkway (South) to Exit 18E – Mill Road, New Rochelle. Bear right off exit ramp. Bear right at first light onto North Avenue. Travel about ¾ of a mile. Club will be on left hand side after shopping area.

From MANHATTAN (WEST SIDE) – Take West Side Highway and go North on Henry Hudson Parkway to Cross County Parkway (East) to Hutchinson River Parkway (North) to Exit 16 – Webster Avenue. Make first left onto Disbrow Lane. Go straight up to top of hill to traffic light. You will be at North Avenue. Club is directly across the street.

From I-95 (North or south) – Get off at Exit 16 – North Avenue. Follow the signs to North Avenue. Make a right onto North Avenue. Take North Avenue about 3 miles. Club is on right hand side of North Avenue.

Welcome to Historic Wykagyl Country Club- Wykagyl is one of the most challenging and beautiful courses in the country. In 1898, a group of ardent sportsmen - anxious to pursue the new game - met and formally organized the club. In 1904, the Members found a new home in New Rochelle. The original course was laid out by Lawrence E. Van Etten, who had joined the club in Pelham in 1904. The course was changed in two steps by two noted golf architects. Donald Ross redesigned several holes in 1919 and A.W. Tillinghast worked on others, including a totally new 17th hole and shortening the 18th, of which Harry Vardon was so fond. In 1994 the Club commissioned noted golf course architect Arthur Hills to supervise a makeover of the entire course. In 2005, the Club hired the firm of Coore-Crenshaw to again maintain the legacy of Wykagyl's storied golf course.

Wykagyl has also been the host for many golf tournaments. These include the famous "Palm Beach Round Robin" from 1948 through 1952, 1956 and 1957, the "Red Cross" Tournament in 1944, the LPGA "Talk" Tournament in 1977, the LPGA "Golden Lights Championship" from 1978 through 1980, the LPGA "Chrysler - Plymouth Classic" in 1982, the LPGA "Master Card International Pro-Am" in 1984, the LPGA Japan Airlines Big Apple Classic 1990-2000, and the LPGA Sybase Classic 2001-2006. In 2007, the Club will host the HSBC Women's World Match Play Championship.

The first organizational meeting of the Professional Golfer's Association was held at Wykagyl in 1916 and its first president was Bob White, Wykagyl's long time Head Golf Professional. The first U.S. Open Championship in 1895 was won by Mr. Horace Rollins, who became head professional here.

UPON ARRIVAL - Please proceed to the **BAG DROP** area at the far left end of the building. Your bag will be handled, and you will be directed to the Locker Facilities, where the attendant will help you find your host.

COURSE ETIQUETTE– Time for 18 Holes of golf is **4hrs 10min**. Players are asked to keep up with the group in front of them. If you are not maintaining pace of play, you will be asked to pick up your ball and advance to the next hole.

GENERAL ATTIRE - Wykagyl is committed to the comfort of all Members and their guests. We ask that you refrain from wearing blue jeans, denims, sweat pants, tee shirts (except at the pool), short-sleeved "mock" necked shirts, spandex, leggings, stirrup pants, tank tops, bare midriffs, cut-offs and short-shorts.

Bermuda shorts are permitted for men no higher than 3" above the knee and for women no higher than mid-thigh. Men are asked to remove hats and visors in any dining area inside the Clubhouse, and shirt tails should be tucked in.

CELL PHONES AND RELATED HANDHELD DEVICES- Members and Guests may use cell phones in the locker rooms, racquets and pool areas or parking lots and should arrange for inaudible incoming capability so as to not disturb the tranquility of others. A cell phone user should be considerate of nearby people. The use of cell phones on the golf course, on all golf practice areas and in dining and bar facilities is prohibited. This includes texting, as well as viewing and sending emails. Persons subject to bona fide emergency on the Golf Course should provide the Pro Shop/Caddy Master telephone numbers (914-632-2359 or 914-636-9112) to their contacts. A Staff Member will drive out and return the person to a phone.
